1.1 SUMMARY AND BACKGROUND

Coastal KZN TVET College (hereafter referred to as “the College”) is a public Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) institution operating across multiple campuses in KwaZulu-Natal.

In line with the College’s mandate to ensure a safe and secure learning and working environment, the College intends to implement a high-security perimeter fencing solution at UMbumbulu Campus.

The proposed fencing system shall be ClearVu (Invisible Wall).

The fencing project forms part of the College’s broader infrastructure-strengthening and security enhancement programme.

1.2 PURPOSE OF THE TENDER

The purpose of this tender is to appoint a qualified and experienced service provider for:

- The supply, delivery, installation, and commissioning of ClearVu (Invisible Wall) high-security fencing system
- Associated civil works and site preparation
- Integration with existing security infrastructure where required
- Provision of warranty and maintenance support.

1.3. OBJECTIVES

The objectives of this project are to:

- Enhance campus security and access control.
- Prevent unauthorized entry, vandalism and theft.
- Ensure compliance with Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) standards.
- Provide durable and low-maintenance perimeter fencing solution.
- Improve overall institutional risk management.

2. REGISTRATION ON CENTRAL SUPPLIER DATABASE

The bidder must be registered on Central Supplier Database (CSD) to do business with the College. A copy of CSD Report must be submitted with the bid and failure to submit will result in disqualification.

3. COMPULSORY DOCUMENTS/ COMPULSORY CONDITIONS OF THE CONTRACT

The bid must be submitted in a sealed envelope with the name of the company, item description and bid number clearly marked on the envelope. The following documents **must** be submitted:

- **Be registered with Company & Intellectual Property Commission (CIPC).**
- **Have valid SARS tax clearance or Tax pin.**
- **BBBE Certificate or Sworn Affidavit**
- **Be registered with Construction Industry Development Board (CIDB) registered (minimum grade 4), Acceptable classifications: SQ, CE, GB.**
- **Provide proof of similar projects completed (minimum 3 reference letters in clear vu fencing).**
- **Submit a valid COIDA certificate.**
- **Submit Public Liability Insurance of R1 000 000 (R1mil).**
- **Bank letter with rating A/B/C**

Failure to submit the above documents will result in disqualification The Bidder must submit a soft copy of the proposal including returnable (USB)

3.2 Stage 2 - Functionality / Technical

The functional/technical evaluation will be based on a threshold, where Bidders who fail to achieve a minimum of 70 points out of a total of 100 points will not be considered further in the evaluation process.

6.Scope of Work

The appointed contractor shall be responsible for the following:

6.1 Site Assessment and Design

- Conduct detailed site inspections.
- Verify measurements and boundary lines.
- Identify underground services prior to excavation.
- Prepare detailed fencing layout drawings.
- Submit method statements and work programme.

6.2 Supply of Materials

- Supply **ClearVu (Invisible Wall)** High-security mesh panels.
- Supply matching posts, brackets, clamps, and fasteners.
- Anti-corrosion coating (hot-dip galvanized and powder coated).
- Concrete for foundations.
- Gates (pedestrian and/or vehicular).
- Electric fence brackets (if specified).

6.3. SYSTEM SPECIFICATION (MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS)

Global – ClearVu System





The fencing system must:

- Be anti-climb and anti-cut.
- Have high-density welded mesh aperture.
- Include concealed fastening system.
- Be tamper-proof.
- Be hot-dip galvanized to SANS standards.
- Powder coated (colour: green).
- Height: As specified per campus (minimum 2.4m unless otherwise stated).
- Designed to accommodate additional security enhancements (e.g., electric fencing).

6.4. INSTALLATION REQUIREMENTS

The contractor shall:

- Clear and prepare the fence line.
- Excavate post holes and cast concrete footings.
- Install posts vertically aligned and securely anchored.
- Install mesh panels with tamper-proof fixings.
- Install gates and locking mechanisms.
- Ensure proper alignment and tension.
- Reinstate disturbed areas to the original condition.

All work must comply with:

- Occupational Health and Safety Act (Act 85 of 1993)
- Construction Regulations
- SANS standards applicable to fencing and galvanizing
